

March 13 - Cheaters Liars and Thieves. How Sam Morse remade the Monterey Peninsula

The story of SFB Morse from childhood through his 54 years here by Charley Osborne. Charley was raised in Pebble Beach on the 1st fairway of Pebble Beach directly across from his grandfather's house. His father, Richard Osborne, was the president of the company and their house is now called Casa Palmero.

Charley went to local schools and California colleges (Davis, Berkeley, UCLA and received an MBA from Santa Clara). He became a securities analyst for Crocker Bank and eventually founded his own management firm in San Francisco, Osborne Partners Capital Management. He retired in 2020 and now lives in the Camel Highlands and Carmel Valley in the summer. He is married (Karen) and has four children.



March 20 - Chinatown before and after the 1906 San Francisco Earthquake

With the help of a Chinese interpreter and guide, Hong Yen, the story of the early Chinese in America begins to unfold. With Arnold Genthe, performed by actor/former Hollywood screenwriter Mark Baer, we view these very rare and authentic photographs taken before, during and after the 1906 San Francisco Earthquake.
